


CHAG SAMEACH

Make the Yom Tov shirt and shoe, light candles and dance with the Torah!




GOOD YOM TOV

On Sukkot, we shake the Lulav and Etrog. We take the Arba Minim, the four different types, hold them together and make the blessing.


The Arba Minim are **Lulav** - a palm branch, **Aravot** - willow, **Hadassim** - myrtle and **Etrog** - citron.




Although you can shake the Lulav anywhere, the best place is in the Sukkah. Can you help the girl shake Lulav in the Sukkah?

- 1. Colour in the pictures,
- 2. Cut out both circles.
- 3. Glue circles to each other, back to back. Make sure the sides marked 'A' are stuck together, and the sides marked 'B' are stuck together.
- **4.** Attach some string through the dots on each side.
- **5.** Twist the string by flipping the disk round them.

Let the string unwind. as the disk spins, it will appear that the girl is bentching Lulav in the Sukkah.








USHIPIZIM

4th night: Moshe, 5th night: Aaron, 6th night: Yosef, 7th night: David.



Use buttons as counters or cut out the ones below.




HOSHANA RABBA



CUTTING THE CAKE





Five boys went to Shule for Hakofot on Simchat Torah. Can you work out which Hakofa each boy held the Torah, and which colour Sefer Torah they held?



ETROG OAT BICKTES

After Sukkot is finished, use your Etrog to make these yummy biscuits.

Ingredients:

1 cup quick cook oats

1/4 cup desiccated coconut

1.5 tsp baking powder

2-3 Tbsp plain flour

40g melted margarine

1 egg

2 Tbsp Honey

Juice of one Etrog (or lemon)(approx 30ml)

Method:

- 1. You will need 2 bowls
- **2.** In the first bowl place the first 4 ingredients, i.e. the dry ingredients, mix them together with a spoon or fork to ensure they are combined
- **3.** In the second bowl whisk the wet ingredients, i.e. melted butter, egg, honey and etrog juice.
- **4.** Add the wet ingredients to dry ingredients, mix to combine (if you feel the mixture is too wet add a little extra flour).
- **5.** Place spoonfuls onto a baking tray, generous tablespoons result in 12 biscuits, you can make smaller spoonfuls, shape the biscuits with the back of your spoon to make them roundish... they don't need to be perfectly round, but you do want the flattish, they will spread a little during baking.
- **6.** Bake at 180°C, for 10-12 mins until just golden on the edges.







INVISUAJE ETROG INK

Making invisible ink is a lot of fun, you can pretend you are a secret agent as you keep all your secret codes and messages hidden from others. All you need is some basic household objects and the hidden power of citrus juice.

You will need:


Half an etrog (or lemon) • Water • Spoon • Bowl • Cotton bud • White paper Lamp or other light bulb

Instructions:

- 1. Squeeze some etrog juice into the bowl and add a few drops of water.
- 2. Mix the water and etrog juice with the spoon.
- **3.** Dip the cotton bud into the mixture and write a message onto the white paper.
- 4. Wait for the juice to dry so it becomes completely invisible.
- **5.** When you are ready to read your secret message or show it to someone else, heat the paper by holding it close to a light bulb.

What's happening?

Citrus juice is an organic substance that oxidises and turns brown when heated. Diluting the citrus juice in water makes it very hard to notice when you apply it the paper, no one will be aware of its presence until it is heated and the secret message is revealed. Other substances which work in the same way include orange juice, honey, milk, onion juice, vinegar and wine. Invisible ink can also be made using chemical reactions or by viewing certain liquids under ultraviolet (UV) light.
